The case for the prosecution relates to the ill-treatment of nearly 4,000 British and Dutch prisoners of war transported by sea in April 1943 from Sourabaya to Prisoner of War Camps at Horoekee, Liang (Ambon) and Amahai (Ceram), which formed a group of P.O.W. Camps under one Commandant.

Lt.Col ANAMI SANSO was the over-all Commander of the said draft of 4,000 Prisoners of War, Captain SHIMADA KURANOSUKE was the chief Medical officer and the remainder of the abovenamed accused were members of the Japanese Camp-Staff, and as such all were responsible, individually and collectively, for several war crimes alleged to be committed between April 1943 and November, 1944 at Sourabaya on sea, and at the aforesaid Camps.

In general terms, the alleged war crimes consisted in:-

1. Inadequate accommodation, lack of food, water and clothing.
2. Failure to provide medical treatment or supplies.
3. Beating the sick, including inmates of hospital, POW doctors, and medical orderlies in order to force them to join working-parties engaged on hard manual work.
4. Public humiliation and beating of POW Officers and Doctors.
5. Employment of the Prisoners on operational and dangerous war-work, e.g. construction of air-fields, loading and unloading cargoes of war-materials etc.
6. Theft of rations, money and personal property of the prisoners.
7. Failure to provide protection against air-raids.
8. Unlawful killing of prisoners in custody.
9. General ill-treatment of Prisoners of War.

The Prosecution proposes to adduce evidence of forty one witnesses, of which five will be produced in Court, to give oral evidence. The evidence of the witnesses will incorporate all or one or more of the following heads : viz

- (a) An account of the so-called medical inspection parade held at Sourabaya in April 1943, by Japanese Doctors including Capt SHIMADA.

The witnesses will state that no individual medical inspection was, in fact, made and further, that the sick and the unfit were compelled, by physical violence, to join the draft to make up the required number. They will particularly refer to the beatings given by Sgt.Maj. MORI and guard KASAYAMA on this occasion. Among others, W/Comdr. Pitts, Capt Van de Logt, Capt Mason, Dr Buning, F/Lt. Blackwood will give an account of this medical inspection parade.

- (b) The bad conditions of living on the boats, during voyage, from Sourabaya to Ambon Island, in April 1943.

According to the witnesses the men were crammed in small holds on the top of dangerous cargo, like bombs, ammunition and aviation petrol. Medical treatment, hygienic facilities, like bathing and latrine arrangements were grossly inadequate. Food was bad and insufficient. Prisoners were subjected to beatings by the Japanese Staff Members and even the helpless sick has their share of such ill-treatment. As a result of the aforesaid causes, dysentery spread among the prisoners and there were nearly 100 dysentery cases when the prisoners disembarked.

- (c) Then witnesses will give an account of the conditions prevailing in one or more of the following camps:-

- (1) Horoekoe
- (2) Liang and other camps on Ambon Islands.
- (3) Amahai (Ceram)

The principle witnesses to testify to the general living conditions in Horoekoe Camp will be W/Comdr. Pitts, Capt Van de Logt, Captain Mass, Dr. Buning, Dr. Springer, F/Lt Blackwood and Lt.De Visser. Their evidence will cover all or some of the general heads, of ill-treatment enumerated above. The total death rate among prisoners in this camp is estimated round about 400. Such deaths are attributed to sheer neglect and callousness on the part of the Japanese staff, individually and collectively. Lt.Col. ANAMI, Capt SHIMADA, Sgt.Maj.MORI and guard KASAYAMA are, among others, particularly singled out by the witnesses.

The principle prosecution witnesses for Liang Camp are Majors GIBSON, and MOSSFORD, LAC., Kitteringham, Trooper Sullivan, LAC. Adamson who all were at one time the inmates of the said camp. Their evidence will be substantially on similar line as that given by the witnesses for Horoekoe Camp. The witnesses estimate the death roll in Liang Camp as about 200 and attribute the cause of the same to neglect and callousness on the part of the Japanese Camp-Staff, including Capt.UEDA Tadao Capt SHIOSAWA and Sgt.Maj. YAMAMOTO.

Trooper Sullivan and LAC Kitteringham will also relate the incident leading to the unlawful killing of Trooper Champion of the Royal Armoured Corps at Ambon Island in or about June 1943. These witnesses will state that the deceased trooper was given a severe beating by Japanese guards and then produced before Lt.Col ANAMI, who, without trial, ordered that Trooper Champion be executed. In pursuance of this order, it appears, Capt UEDA TADAO and Sgt Maj. YAMAMOTO formed an execution party and led away Trooper Champion to a spot some way from Liang Camp where Trooper Champion was done to death and buried at the same place, in the presence of Capt. UEDA.

As for the conditions of living in the Amahai (Ceram) Camp, prosecution will produce the evidence of Capt Mason Pte Meyer and Van Setters. This evidence will be similar lines as that given by the witnesses for other camps. This camp had an existence of about six months starting from May 43. Capt SHIOSAWA was in charge of this camp. About 100 prisoners died at this camp.

- (d) The last phase of the prosecution case relates to the ill fated voyage of the s.s. "Maros" renamed "Harayoshi Maru", with about 650 sick prisoners of war on board.

The witnesses will relate how a reign of terror prevailed on this boat, how patients died craving for water at a time when Japanese staff had fresh water for bathing purposes, how men died of sheer neglect, callousness and brutality on the part of the Japanese staff, how dead bodies were unceremoniously cast overboard, almost naked, with crude weights attached to their feet. Witnesses F/Lt Blackwood, F/O Mason Valkenburg, Schreuders, Capt. Van Goor, among others, will implicate particularly for these crimes, Sgt.Maj. MORI, Guard KASAYAMA. Nearly 400 lives are alleged to have been lost during this voyage.

The last charge is against Sgt.Maj MORI and Guard KASAYAMA only. The alleged incidents of ill-treatment took place at Landsop Camp, Bandoeng, in May and June 1945. The evidence of prisoners alleged to be ill-treated viz., W/Comdr, Alexander and Pitts, Lt.Col. Macarthey-Fligate and Malsey and eye-witness Mills Burden, will be produced in support of this charge. Sgt.Maj. MORI and Guard Kasayama have also made a statement in this connection.

Originals of statements made by the accused persons will also be produced in evidence.
