With reference to your recent application to serve with the Royal Australian Air Force as a member of an Air Crew under the Empire Air Scheme, I have to inform you that at your examination you were successful in passing the necessary tests. In the first instance, therefore, you have been selected to enter an initial Training School as trainee air crew. Final assessment will be dependent upon the progress and ability displayed by you during the Initial Training Course.

Additional training schools are being established in accordance with the proseas. a laid down at the Ottawa Conference for the development of the licalire Air Training Scheme. As the number of air crew applicants offering at present is in excess of the capacity of the existing training organisation, it will be necessary to place successful applicants on a waiting list from which they will be called up when additional training facilities are created.

In the meantime, therefore, you have been enrolled in the Royal Australian Air Force Reserve, with the rank of Aircraftman Class 2, Group V, and will remain a member of the Reserve for the period you are on the waiting list. The Official Badge of the Royal Australian Air Force Reserve is enclosed/ has already been handed to you.

> It is thought unlikely that you will be called up before Oct, 1941

When called up for training, you automatically cease to be a member of the Reserve, and you will be required to surrender the Official Badge on taking up training.

It will not be necessary for you to communicate further with this Office, except in the event of changing your address, as you will receive ample notice of the date upon which you are to report for training.

DEAR SIR,

With reference to your recent application for entry into the Royal Australian Air Force, it is requested that you report to the above address at 8.30 a.m on FRI. 7th Nov., 1941, for enlistment (subject to medical review), as an air crew in Group V, with the rank and pay of Aircraftman, Class II, in readiness to proceed to an Initial Training School.

To enable arrangements to be completed with Initial Training Schools it is essential you should notify me within seven days should you NOT be able to report on that date. You must realise that only a very special reason will justify your non-attendance.

The following certificates applicable to you are to be produced when reporting:-

- (a) Marriage certificate and birth certificates of any children.

  (Recruiting Centre to be advised immediately if married since enrolment on the Reserve.)
- (b) Militia, Army, or Naval discharge papers.
- (c) Completed Form M/F. 3 (enclosed).
- (d) Completed Forms M/F. 4 and 5, if claiming dependant's allowance.

Enlistment is for the duration of the war, and for a period of up to twelve months thereafter. Air crews are liable for service in Australia or overseas, but the majority, however, will be required for service overseas.

The daily rate of pay applicable to your appointment is 5/- per diem for the first period of the initial training course. (Pay is issuable for seven days a week.) After this period of initial training, candidates selected for training as pilots, air observers or wireless operatorair gunners will be re-classified as follows:—

Trainees as Wireless Operator-Air Gunners who fail to complete successfully the Wireless Course continue their training as Air Gunner (L.A.C., Group V).

On completion of training, trainees who successfully graduate will be granted higher rank as under:—

Air Observer	six months service) (Group I) or Service after
Wireless Operator - Air Gunner	Group) when serving with the R.A.F.
