

Released Prisoners

Having spent four years as a prisoner of war in Germany since his capture on Crete, Private Harold Fingleton is now safe in England. He is the eldest son of Mr and Mrs P. Fingleton, of Sandgate.

Mr and Mrs R. J. Rice, of Gaunt Street, Newmarket, have been notified that their only son, Private Raymond John Rice, is now in England, since his release from a German prisoner of war camp, where he was held for four years. He was captured on Crete.

Mrs E. W. Green, of Coorparoo, has received a cable from her husband Flying Officer E. W. Green, telling of his safe arrival in England from a German prisoner of war camp. Flying Officer Green is the son of Mr and Mrs C. L. Green, of Toowong.

Mrs J. Shaw, of Young Street, Annerley, has received official advice that her only son, Sergt. George A. Shaw, AIF, who was taken prisoner of war more than four years ago, has been repatriated to England.

Mrs J. Warner, of 61 Park Road, Woolloowin, has received word that her sons, Privates V. G. and W. J. Warner, who have been four years as prisoners of war in Germany are now safe in England.

Mrs T. P. R. Hardy has received a cable from her son, Lieut. Stan B. R. Hardy to say that he has arrived in England fit and well after having been a prisoner of war in Germany for four years.

Mrs K. Nalder has received word that her husband, Pte Kevin Nalder, has arrived in England, after having been a prisoner of war in Germany for four years. He is a son of Mr and Mrs C. V. Nalder, Annerley.

Mr and Mrs Oscar T. Fuhrman-Luck have received word that their son, Sapper Oscar Fuhrman-Luck, is now safe in the United Kingdom after having been a prisoner of war in Germany for three years.

Mr and Mrs J. R. French, of Toowoomba, have been advised that their son, Private John French, is now safe and well in the United Kingdom, after having been a prisoner of war for over four years in Italian and German camps.
