We are now in receipt from our agents of the following further report concerning the death of the above named soldier.

Lt. J.G. Pitt, 8th Battalion has stated:-
"It is hardly right to say Temple "Died of Wounds". He was found dead in a dugout at "China Wall" and it was reported in the Battalion that he had been gassed. I have no doubt from what I heard that he died from poisoning, and not from wounds. He was buried in the Military Cemetery near "Irish House," I saw him buried myself. The Huns now hold the burial ground and neighborhood."
