"I knew Casualty. He was a man about 5 ft. 8 ins. medium complexion, about 35 years of age known as Den. Casualty was coming out of action on the 19th April from the 2nd gaza and was making for the horse lines in Yedda Shiek Muran. An H.E. shell exploded near Casualty killing him almost instantly. I was 50 yds. away at the time when the shell exploded. I went over and had a look at casualty. His chief wounds were about the chest. We could not get any stretcher bearers owing to the heavy shelling we were under and he had to be left there. A party went out three weeks later and recovered the body. He was buried just where he fell. He was a very popular man and was a great favourite amongst the boys. I was an eye-witness."

We called him "Don". He was a Queenslander, fair, about 12 stone. His business had to do with horses.

Witness confirmed April 19th as the date he remembers Carrington being wounded near Tel-el-Jemny, during the Gaza attack. He saw Carrington being carried out by some of the Unit. He was on a rifle being held by the men on which he had to be supported. He was informed that later a shell burst and killed Carrington and those carrying him, the occurrence being observed by a man named Bucholtz of the Australian Army Medical Corps, who has since died. It was Bucholtz who told Witness what happened and apparently only a few minutes elapsed between Carrington being wounded and killed.

I have communicated with Mrs Carrington, as her son's death several times, and the day after he was killed, I wrote her a letter explaining the circumstances. He was one of the finest men I have ever met, and he never knew what fear was, a fine example of Australian manhood. Carrington was blown to atoms, whilst being carried away wounded. He was hit in the stomach by a bullet on the 19th April, 1917, at about 3 p.m. during an advance, and was being carried away to the rear by his comrades, when a H.E. dropped almost on top of him, killing two of his comrades and himself. He was buried on the field with soldiers honours, and we had to retire that day, as we were being hard pressed. I know he was buried, because he was in my - , I will send you the exact position on the map, when I can get my book, which is now up (?), with my - - . Carrington has the full details - - to her.
