Enlisting on 23rd August 1941, - **Private Jack Ramsay WARMING**, **AIF WW2** –

Service in Australia and Asia. On the 15th April 1942 he was stationed with the Australian Army Ordnance Corps in Singapore when they were captured by the Japanese Imperial Army.

Jack, like so many others, was worked hard in terrible conditions with little food and virtually no medicines and died of disease in a Prisoner of War camp in Thailand on the 6th of April 1944, almost two years after being made a prisoner of war. He is buried at the <u>KANCHANABURI WAR CEMETERY</u>. He was 40 years old.

Jack was born in Adelaide on the 9^{th} of December 1903. He was a metal finisher and body builder when he enlisted. He was married to Thelma Catherine Warming and had a daughter, Veronica.

Jack WARMING had joined and played for the WEST ADELAIDE Football Club from the North Adelaide Ramblers in the 1927 season.

John WOODS was the 382^{nd} player to debut for West Adelaide Football Club, his league debut on Saturday the 27^{th} day of August 1927. (the clubs 35^{th} year)
