It is very strained circumstances that this letter is being written, you see I have just come back from an operation and the last next-bed is doing a good turn of the day by writing for me. I had better tell you what is to do with me, I have a broken leg and had a piece of shrapnell removed before the setting. Here they don't keep your leg in splints, but put it in a plaster cast which makes it possible to walk in two to three weeks so that not at all bad. Yes I am doing fine and I think I can make it like the others are doing. I suppose I had better tell you I am a prisoner of war somewhere in Greece. It's a very nice hospital I am in and run by an Australian unit which makes me feel quite at home. By the way when I do get on my feet we have a lovely roof for sun bathing so you can think of me doing plenty. I am afraid I am running short of words as there is very little I can write about, but you can remember me to anyone who enquires as to me, where about I shall have to finish now, wishing you all of the best in health and every thing.
