
## **Phillip Alexander Young**



Private (Pte) 2231 Phillip Alexander Young enlisted in the 14<sup>th</sup> Infantry Battalion in the 4<sup>th</sup> Infantry Brigade in Melbourne on 6 February 1915. He embarked overseas on 17 June and disembarked in Egypt about four weeks later.

Pte Young wasn't given much time to acclimatise though, because the high number of battle casualties and losses from illness on Gallipoli, together with the imminent August offensive, meant that every able-bodied man was needed. As a result, he was not long in Egypt and embarked for Gallipoli on 1 August, where he was taken on strength of the 14<sup>th</sup> Battalion on or about 5 August.

On 6 August, the Australian feint attack on Lone Pine commenced and the next day, the 4<sup>th</sup> Brigade, including the 14<sup>th</sup> Battalion, commenced its march toward Hill 971, the main Australian objective of the entire offensive.

In the difficult terrain and under fire for much of the time, the  $4^{th}$  Brigade became lost and sustained hundreds of casualties during 7-8 August, and never reached Hill 971.

The 14<sup>th</sup> Battalion alone sustained 257 casualties, including 164 killed or missing, one of whom was Pte Young, who was killed in action on 8 August 1915.

His body was never recovered, and he has no known grave.

Private 2231 Phillip Alexander Young is remembered on Panel 43 of the Lone Pine Memorial.
