Arthur William Garner



Private (Pte) 960 Arthur William Garner enlisted in the 22^{nd} Infantry Battalion in the 6^{th} Infantry Brigade of the 2^{nd} Australian Division in Melbourne on 10 February 1915. He was promoted to Lance Corporal (L Cpl) on 1 May and embarked overseas on 10 May. He disembarked in Egypt about four weeks later.

L Cpl Garner left Egypt on 30 August and landed on Gallipoli on 5 September. The next day, the 22nd Battalion entered the line in the Lone Pine sector, which was deemed a "quiet" part of the front by that stage, as most of the fighting continued to the north.

L Cpl Garner became ill and was evacuated from Gallipoli on 24 September. Diagnosed with rheumatic fever, he was treated at St John's Hospital on Malta between 2 October – 7 January 1916.

He returned to Egypt on 11 January, where he was admitted to the No. 1 Australian General Hospital at Heliopolis for three weeks.

He embarked for Australia on 3 March and disembarked in Melbourne on 30 March.

Lance Corporal 960 Arthur William Garner was discharged from the AIF as medically unfit on 6 August 1916.
