Owen Curle



Private (Pte) 3286 Owen Curle enlisted in the 38th Infantry Battalion in the 10th Infantry Brigade of the 3rd Australian Division in South Melbourne on 15 October 1917. He embarked overseas on 22 December and disembarked in Southampton, after short stops at Suez and Taranto enroute, on 14 February 1918.

He spent three weeks with an undisclosed illness in the Hurdcott Military Hospital from 26 February -18 March, then joined the 9^{th} (Brigade) Training Battalion at Fovant on 30 March.

He departed England on 28 May and landed in France the next day, where he was taken on strength of the 38th Battalion, in the field at Villers-Bretonneux, on 5 June 1918.

The 38th Battalion was in reserve for the allies' Amiens offensive on 8 August and played no active part on the first day. In the lead up to the attack on Proyart planned for 10 August, Pte Curle was caught in the open and killed in action during a German artillery bombardment on 9 August 1918. The ground was not held, and his body was never recovered, so he has no known grave.

Private 3286 Owen Curle is remembered on the Australian National Memorial, Villers-Bretonneux, France.
