Caught the bus in to Brandon this evening. Booked a room at a hotel and then dropped out to No 12 S.F.T.S and saw Pat Bevis. He came top of his class in both air and ground work. They were doing a little celebrating in the Sergeants' Mess. They had their wings parade this afternoon. Pat came into town with me after it was all over, and then got a lift home again in the station wagon.

Friday, June 11, 1943

162nd Day—203 Days to Follow

I arose at 4:30 and caught the 5:30 train to Winnipeg - saw Irene at Portage. Gave Mrs Shaw a ring and found that they are leaving for Lake Du Bonnet about 7 pm. I poked around most of the day doing shopping. Went to a show this afternoon and saw Charles Laughton in "This Land is Mine". Rang Rae but did not see her. She goes on annual leave to-morrow. Met the Shaws at the Airmans' Club at 7 pm - they drove me out to Lake Du Bonnet where I met Mr & Mrs Jim Uhlman and their daughter Shan - about 6 yrs old.

Saturday, June 12, 1943

163rd Day—202 Days to Follow

Jim Uhlman is the chief pilot of the Manitoba Government Air Service which is the air branch of the forestry dept. They have several Fairchild 82's on floats which they use for forest patrol work - on the look out for forest fires. When there is not much danger of fires in winter, spring and wet summers they do jobs for other departments - mines and resource

fisheries and game, as well as flying ~~of~~ supplies etc to patrol men and game wardens. This afternoon Mrs Uhlman took me for a walk around the township of Lake Du Bonnet, which is very pretty. Jim showed me his photos - of which he has a very

varied and interesting collection.

Monday, June 14, 1943

165th Day—200 Days to Follow

This morning (Sunday) Jim took Shan - and their dog & myself on a trip to Lake St George where we picked up a game warden, then we flew into Lake St Patrick where we unloaded some stores. Then we flew on to Beren's River where we picked up a few drums of petrol. I met the manager of the Hudson's Bay post and his wife - bought a few souvenirs.

We flew back to Lake St Patrick at 20 ft above the water. Saw some moose swimming in the lake, also saw a beaver's dam. We then shot up an Indian village landed in the lake, unloaded the petrol, flew back to Lake St George where we had lunch with the game warden & his wife & 3 young children - They had not seen anyone for several months. Then we did some low flying all the way down W coast of L. Winnipeg - I took some occasional photos - shot up Indians - fishing boats, & on the shore etc. Took some photos of the paper mills at the

Then we flew on up the river
and I took a couple of photos
of the rapids, one of the bridge
and a couple of the town. I
then had tea, and caught the
6:0 pm bus into town. Caught
