This undoubtedly contributed to the success of the operation. Again this N.C.O. by splendid work with his gun on the road through DUMIR. contributed greatly to the success of the Brigade there. He remained with his gun throughout the day, though hit in the leg, getting through a lot of footwork, making no complaints and refusing to see a doctor until ordered by an Officer to do so. James Alphonse MOODIE	While in charge of a flank patrol at SASA on 30th Sept 1918. his N.C.O. came on a party of 122 Germans with machine guns aiming to explode our flank. not having time to warn the main guard, this N.C.O. with his patrol of 3 men, in company with another N.C.O. and patrol of later strength with great dash and determination firing from their houses charged the enemy whom they dispersed and forced to surrender.
