LOCATIONS; Quirindi, Westdale Tamworth, Cape town South Africa, Hamilton, Taree, New Lambton.

OCCUPATIONS; He played football. Rugby Union being the game of choice for the Nicholl family when it came to football. The family moved from Quirindi to Westdale – West Tamworth when William Albert was 15 years old, circa 1913. William Albert worked as a labourer in the Tamworth area before enlisting in the 1st AIF at age 20. He was in the militia. He was in hospital in South Africa when the war ended. Following military service he worked for the PMG (post master general) department as a telephone linesman, and a linesman inspector.

After returning from the war my grandfather returned to hospital in Tamworth where he met nurse Gertrude Lock whom he married. The family lived in the Newcastle suburbs of Hamilton (Newcastle), Taree and New Lambton (Newcastle), a new home was built in 1939 in Rex Avenue New Lambton. For a time he worked in Taree, living in Fotheringham Street Taree. William was born in Hamilton a suburb of Newcastle NSW, whereas my father Darby was born in Taree NSW. The family travelled much between Newcastle and Tamworth (both Nicholl and Lock’s were from Tamworth), my father always spoke of the old “Essex” car, his cousins also told me of it, apparently it was a two seater with a dickie / rumble seat in the rear. I can only remember the little Ford Prefect which came after the Essex and would have been a new car at the time. I can recall sitting in the middle front of this car. The other vehicle I remember was the fire engine red Ford Zepher utility with the gold letters “PMG” on the doors.

SOLDIER (ANZAC). William Albert was one of four brothers who enlisted in the 1st AIF, enlisting late in the war he was a reinforcement. He never made it to the front, he was in hospital in South Africa when armistice came, from where he was returned to Australia.

**1st AIF 1918 enlistment – “March to Freedom” – Hunter Valley NSW Australia
4/5/1918 (Armidale) – 6/6/1918 (Newcastle).**

Conscription was rejected twice by Australians during the first world war. As a consequence there was a decline in recruits due largely to great losses early in the war. Patriotic men from Gilgandra established the first Coe-march in 1916, this was to be the first of many. For the series of marches that followed, some were entirely by foot, some by a mixture of foot and rail. Most new conscripts were reinforcements.

One such march was the “march to freedom” commencing at Armidale NSW on 4th May 1918, the march passed through Maitland early in June before terminating in Newcastle NSW on 6th June 1918, from where recruits travelled to Sydney by rail. Described by some journalists as a miniature army, the March to Freedom was equipped with an 18 pounder, a mobile searchlight, a travelling kitchen, an ambulance wagon and a band. In addition, there were two officers accompanying 150 rank and file, most of whom were recently enlisted reinforcements. A small group of returned servicemen were included in the march. The march stopped at regional centres for two to three days where concerts, boxing exhibitions, cinema shows and military manoeuvres were exhibited. Recruits were attracted with stirring patriotic speeches and by direct appeal. Sixty-eight volunteers were received at Tamworth, 42 of whom were passed as fit. Uniforms to fit all sizes were carried enabling recruits to be equipped on the spot and thus join the march. Other “march to freedom” events occurred at different times in other districts.

William Albert Nicholl enlisted on the 14th of May 1918 at Tamworth being the fourth brother to join the 1st AIF, three elder brothers having served, two being killed, one in Europe and one in the Middle East. Like many he had experience in the Militia of the day and was passed as medically fit at recruitment. Joining the “march to freedom” he likely saw family along the way, for example sisters, Maud Mary (Mary) Mahoney of Singleton and Elsie Eva (Eva) Gilmore of Maitland.

We assume from Newcastle he travelled to Sydney by rail for further basic training, then travelled to Western Australia, I believe to Albany. He was delayed in Albany where the troop transport vessel was waiting for naval escort vessels before leaving Australian waters. Some of the vessels and dates are a little confusing. The postcard photo we have of the vessel he was supposedly on is “Borda”, it is likely he travelled from Sydney (17/7/1918) to Western Australia on the “Borda” and then from Western Australia (30/7/1918) to South Africa on the “SS Gaika”, although records seem to indicate otherwise. A military historian would better understand the protocols for troop movements inside Australia. Upon leaving Western Australia he fell ill and was put off in South Africa where he was admitted to military hospital for treatment. The illness reads as though he had middle ear infections. Some dates;

4/9/18 – Gaika on route to UK – ‘Ships order’ disembark Cape town due to illness. Admitted to general hospital and later to convalescent hospital Cape town South Africa.

7/11/18 – Discharge from hospital as fit for service with AIF.

11/11/18 – Armistice.




4/12/18 – Return to Australia aboard HMAS Marathon, although there appears to have been issues here with troops breaking quarantine requirements. (Spanish flu).





19/2/19 – Discharged from active service with 1st AIF.




His personal correspondence indicates he was close to being fit to proceed to the fighting when armistice came. His military record indicates he was discharged from hospital as fit for service on 7/11/1918. Subsequently he was returned to Australia, fortunately for us not having reached the front.



Note 1; One of his cousins Edward Bliss Jolly (jr) appears to have returned from the UK on the “Borda” at cessation of hostilities.

Note 2; IMAGES; There was a collage of Great War images for my Grandfathers elder brothers displayed at his home in New Lambton NSW Australia. I assume it was prepared by my great grandmother Sarah Jane Nicholl at Westdale, however my grandfather did not feature on it as he had enlisted late in the war after two of his brothers had been killed. We returned it to Tamworth to one of Percy’s daughters Jill, Percy being remembered on it. Unfortunately, I do not know what ultimately happened to it.

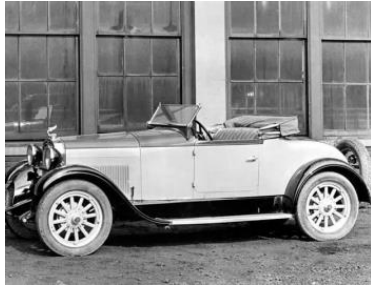
