
## **Frank Sterling Wood**

Private (Pte) 55477 Frank Sterling Wood enlisted in the  $6^{th}$  General (Victorian) Reinforcements in Ballarat on 24 April 1918. He embarked overseas on 17 July and while in transit was hospitalised with venereal disease from 19-23 July.

He disembarked in London on 27 September, where he was allotted to the  $6^{th}$  Infantry Battalion reinforcements at Fovant Camp in Wiltshire the same day. He spent a week in the Camp Military Hospital with an unspecified illness from 14-21 October, then transferred to the No. 2 Convalescent Depot at Weymouth on 30 November.

He was subsequently declared medically unfit for overseas service (due to asthma) and embarked for return to Australia on 10 December 1918.

Private 55477 Frank Sterling Wood disembarked in Melbourne on 8 February, where he was medically discharged from the AIF on 23 February 1919.
