There may be others not yet reported, this list of men who are known personally to most of us are well worthy of our utmost efforts to see that those extra comforts are provided to help them feel they are not forgotten, and to help relieve the utter monotony that they have to endure in the prison camps. We, ourselves, are enduring very little more discomfort than before the war. They are not allowed to say what their discomforts are—but we can form a pretty good idea. It costs £52 a year to provide each Prisoner of War with those extra comforts and clothing that are necessary to keep him reasonably provided for. That is the object of this dance on July 24—to give everyone on King Island an opportunity to do something to help these men who have sacrificed everything for us. Give the matter serious consideration—it is a most urgent cause—then buy a ticket, attend the dance, or make a donation to the committee.
