

Background

Coinciding with the Centenary of Anzacs our incentive behind the series of biographical publications is the Adelaide University Football and Cricket Club's desire to honour our players who served in the Great War (1914 - 1918). These brave men put on hold their academic, professional and sporting careers for King and Country in the name of peace and freedom. The AUFC/AUCC WW1 Memorial Committee is endeavouring to identify every one of our players who served and prepare life stories on all. This is to ensure their sacrifices and further contributions to society will be recognised by future generations.

On Anzac Day 2015, the Centenary of the Gallipoli landing, a memorial plaque was unveiled on the Adelaide University Oval Pavilion and this was followed by the erection of a picket fence between the pavilion and the scoreboard with each picket bearing a plaque with the name of an AUFC/AUCC player who served.

'On the 14th September, 1917, at ZILLEBEKE, the 18th Battery position was heavily shelled from 3 p.m. to 4.30 p.m. with 5.9" and 8". At 3.36 p.m. an ammunition dump alongside No. 1 gun was hit and it and the gun pit caught fire. These men [8360 M.A. COCKER, 8381 D.D. BRADBURY, (8381) Lt E.J. SHEPHERD, (10762) Lt L. CARTHEW] on Lieutenant DODD calling for a party rushed out of the shelter trench in the face of the heavy fire and with water from adjacent shell holes succeeded in putting it out. Later the pit was again hit and it and the ammunition and an adjacent pit caught fire. These men again went out with Lieutenant DODD in the face of the shelling and succeeded in saving the guns and ammunition. They displayed great gallantry and determination in the face of very considerable danger.'


Early Life

Lancelot was born in 1893, the son of Stephen Pellew Carthew and Sarah Ann Mackereth. He had four brothers Stephen, Sydney, George, and John and four sisters Mrs. Norris (of Adelaide), Mrs. J. McNamara (of Blackwood) and Misses Stella and Ada Carthew (per his father's headstone at Scott Creek Cemetery).


Education

Lance attended Adelaide High School where he completed his Primary Public Exams in 1909 and Junior Public Exams in 1910. In the Senior Public Exams in 1911 he passed seven subjects and was mentioned in the General Honor List.. While at Adelaide High School he demonstrated excellent sporting attributes playing both football and cricket. He captained the football team in 1911.


Adelaide High School 1st Football Team 1909




Adelaide High School 1st Football Team 1910




Adelaide High School 1st Football Team 1911

Adelaide High School 1st XI Cricket Team 1911




Adelaide University

After High School he began studying to become a Teacher at the Teachers Training College and completed subjects at the Adelaide School of Arts and Adelaide University.


Adelaide University Sports

Lance played both Football (1914 & 1915) and Cricket (1914/15) for Adelaide University. He played in the 1914 Intervarsity Football match against Melbourne University and gained a Blue for Football. Lance was also a member of the Adelaide University Rifle Club. $^{\lor}$



World War I

Lance enlisted on 7 September 1915 as a Gunner in the Field Artillery Brigade. He was a 22 year old student and was described as 5 foot 10 inches high with a medium complexion, blue eyes and dark hair. Lance embarked from Melbourne, Victoria, on board HMAT A19 *Afric* on 5 January 1916. His service was on the Western Front.

He received the Military Medal for action at Zillebeke on 14 September 1917 for "great gallantry and determination in the face of very considerable danger". Lance saw the matter quite differently and he described the incident as follows, in a letter to the students at Adelaide High School.

"Thank you very much for the congratulations; in my case were hardly deserved, as I did nothing at all extraordinary - the only thing was that there happened to be an officer nearby. You see, our gun post was set on fire by a shell from Fritz, and as we had some stuff in it we dashed out to the rescue. The fire was put out and the gun and ammunition saved, and I got my things, so everything was all right. He was putting over some 8-inch stuff at the time, so it was a foolish thing to do; however we all got out of it, so was quite all right. Yes, I know sergeant Bradbury. He was at the school the first year I was there. I knew him then. At present he is away from the battery pretty ill with dysentery. All the same, you can cut the hero rot out, as there was nothing heroic about it - more of an impulse than anything - to be heroic a thing must be deliberate in my estimation, and that was anything but deliberate. He returned to South Australia on the Nestor on 12 December 1919.

Post War Studies

Lance recommenced his studies at Adelaide University in 1920 and gained a Division III pass in Physics I in November 1920^{vii}. He was President of the Adelaide High School Old Scholars Association in 1920^{viii}

Sport

Lance played football for Sturt from 1920, commencing in the B grade and becoming the 220th A grade player for Sturt when he played his first game on 31 July 1920. He played 14 matches for Sturt in 1920-1921.

Marriage and Family

Lance married Doris Cleggett on 26th December 1923 at Christ Church. Xi Lance and Doris's first child (a son, Brian) was born on 3rd November 1924. Xii Their daughter was born in 1924, Xiii followed by a son (Lancelot George) who tragically lived only 13 months Xiv and finally a son (John) in 1929. Xiv

Career

Lance was Headmaster of five schools throughout a teaching career that spanned over 30 years.

Other Activities

Lance was actively involved in the communities where he was Headmaster including being Captain of the Kooringa Football team and the Kooringa Cricket Club 1925. A member of the Kooringa Tennis and Burra Golf Clubs. Secretary of the local RS&SI League. XXIIII

Further Studies

Lance graduated with a BA from Adelaide University in 1932.

World War II Service

Lance served in the 9th Battalion South Australian Volunteer Defence Corp (VDC) from 15th April 1942 to 14 February 1946. The DVC was modelled on the British Home Guard.

Death

Lance died at the Blackwood Community Hospital on Feb. 10, 1967 and is buried in Centennial Park Cemetery, Plot: RSL, Wall 126, Niche B002^{xxiv}.

Family Legacy (Sons)

Brian Carthew (b 1924 - d 1997) attended Adelaide University and graduated in 1947 with a Bachelor of Engineering degree (Mining). He was employed by B.H.P. in Broken Hill after graduation.

John Carthew (b 1929 - d 2019) also studied at Adelaide University earning a Bachelor of Engineering degree (Mining) in 1952. In the 1970s he was the Superintendent of Collieries, Queensland Coal Mining Company Ltd. He was a member of the Panel of the Warden's Enquiry into the accident at the KIANGA NO. 1.UNDERGROUND MINE ON SATURDAY, 20th SEPTEMBER, 1975. There had been 13 fatalities.
