he had to continually pass through heavy artillery
and machine gun fire, and enemy sniping.

9th. Battn. 4564 Private Frank
A.I.F. SPEARRITT

Near LE BARQUE, FRANCE, on 25/26th. February, do Military
1917, Pte. SPEARRITT, a Company signaller, showed Medal
great pluck and devotion to duty, by going out
continually during heavy shell and machine gun
fire to repair broken signal wires. He also
acted as a runner between the outpost line and
battalion headquarters, and continually passed
through a heavy fire without the slightest hesitation.
