

President Frank James Owen OAM Sub-Branch Annual Dinner 2011

Frank Owen, quite suddenly and unexpectedly, passed away in his sleep on Friday 21 December 2018. It came as a great shock to all who knew him. Frank celebrated his 80th birthday on Saturday 15 December 2018 and, as I am told, enjoyed himself very well.

Frank was, for many years, the backbone of the RSL Morphett Vale and District Sub-Branch. It is fair to say that without his guidance and astute leadership that our Sub-Branch would not be in the great position that it is today. Frank's knowledge of all things RSL was, in my opinion, second to none and he was more than willing to share this knowledge when his opinion was sought and I did this on many occasions in my early years as Secretary. He was my friend, my respected mentor and a wonderful man just to have a chat and spend time with.

Nothing seemed to be too much trouble for Frank. He was always one of the first to put his hand up to help with all manner of Sub-Branch projects even if he did not whole-heartedly agree with them at times such was his commitment to the Sub-Branch. There are too many projects over the years to mention but we all know of the many hours that he spent in ensuring that our Sub-Branch was up amongst the best in the State. Since my move to Encounter Bay I will be forever grateful for all of the things that he did for me that I could not do because of the tyranny of distance on my part. If I needed something to be done at the Sub-Branch I only had to ring Frank and he would say "I'm on to it" and I knew it would be done.

I am extremely grateful to have known, and worked with, Frank. Every time I left the Sub-Branch to drive home to Encounter Bay he would warn me to "look out for the kangaroos" as we shook hands. In recent times Dierdre has kept up this tradition and, for this, I am grateful.

At Frank's funeral on Thursday 3 January 2019 there were a number of people who said some very meaningful words about Frank and how he had impacted on their lives. With his consent I have included below the eulogy presented at Frank's funeral by his long time mate, and former President of the RSL (SA Branch), Mr Jock Statton, AM.

EULOGY PRESENTED BY MR JOCK STATTON, AM.

"When asked by Frank's Family to do a eulogy on behalf of the Returned and Services League (SA Branch) I accepted with honour. I thought I had a good knowledge of Frank's involvement - that was until I started to collate it.

I have known Frank since around 1980, this was after Frank became a Member of the Morphett Vale and District Sub-Branch. Frank joined the Morphett Vale Sub-Branch in August 1986 and was elected as Honorary Secretary in the same year, holding the position until 1991. In 1992 Frank was elected Sub-Branch President, the position he served in until 1995.

Frank gave himself a self-imposed three year exile from serving on the Morphett Vale Sub-Branch Committee. During this period Frank was a member of the Willunga Sub-Branch. This was a hard period for Frank. He enjoyed the friendship of the Willunga Members, but I believe Frank was hurt by the situation at Morphett Vale, and his reason for stepping down. Not that he would ever say so.

After the three year break Frank was re-elected President of Morphett Vale Sub-Branch, a position he held until 2017. I believe the three year break gave Frank the opportunity to re-evaluate his continuing work within the RSL and as an outcome of this period Frank's input to the RSL, State and National, was invaluable.

In 1994 Frank was elected as State Councillor for the Alexandra Group a positon he held for many years. For those who don't know, Alexandra Group consists of Morphett Vale, Port Noarlunga/Christies Beach, McLaren Vale, Willunga, Goolwa, Port Elliott, Victor Harbor and Yankalilla. Mt Compass, which is now closed, was also part of the District. This group has been acknowledged at the Wat Veterans Home, Myrtle Bank, for the thousands of dollars raised for the Home, with the naming of Alexandra Park at the entrance to the Home.

Frank has represented the RSL in various forums, visiting primary and high schools, explaining the importance of ANZAC Day and Remembrance Day. These schools could be anywhere between Rosewater and Woodville to McLaren Vale. This also included many Youth and Community Groups. If I ever needed someone to cover a group or a school I knew I could always rely on Frank as a backup.

One of the groups Frank enjoyed addressing were students at the Migration Museum. When they had displays at the museum on war or conflict, Frank and I would be invited by Rosa and Staff to talk to the Students. If the subject, the effect on families whilst serving overseas came up, which quite often it did, Frank occasionally could get quite emotional, a side of Frank a lot of people may not have seen.

Frank was committed to ensuring the Youth of today have an understanding of ANZAC and Remembrance Days. Frank's involvement in the "The Youth Vigil in the South" in which Frank was on the planning and inception Committee from 2003 until his passing. Frank co-ordinated the Service for the Youth on the ANZAC Eve Service.

The future residents of the South may not know Frank Owen OAM although one of his legacies will be there in plain view. The City of Onkaparinga Memorial Garden and War Memorial. Frank was a member of the Onkaparinga City Council Planning Committee establishing the City's Memorial Gardens. Frank was awarded the Australia Day Council Medallion in 2003 for his involvement in this project. This memorial holds the largest attended ANZAC Eve Service in the State.

From 1986 to 2012 Frank organised the planning and execution of ANZAC and Remembrance Day Services. In 2012 Gordon Curtis, the Secretary of the Morphett Vale RSL Sub-Branch, accepted the responsibility of these important commemorations.



Frank enjoyed trips visiting Sub-Branches and catching up with old acquaintances from previous trips or Sub-Branch Conferences. His wealth of knowledge on constitutional and Sub-Branch procedure were appreciated by all. Occasionally Frank would counsel me on my interpretation of the rules.

Frank had a long and strong association with the RSL, since his return from Vietnam in 1970, the Streaky Bay Sub-Branch welcomed him home as a member.

Some of the highlights of Frank's RSL service are:

2001 awarded the Australian Centenary Medal.

2003 Life Membership RSL for Service to Veterans.

2005 Onkaparinga City Council Citizen of the Year.

2007 awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia for services to Veterans.

2009 accompanied the then Governor of South Australia Rear Admiral Kevin Scarce AC CSC on the Premier's ANZAC Spirit School prize for students to the Western Front. Frank had the honour on behalf of all Australian Veterans to place a wreath at the Villers-Bretonneux Dawn Service.

RSL Representative on the Judging Committee of Students and Teachers for the Premier's ANZAC Spirit School prize and addressing students and families before and after their tour.

Organising RSL ANZAC Day sports medals, advising on the naming for soccer, lacrosse, Australian Rules Football and netball in the southern area.

Supported the Banka Straits Memorial Service.

State Branch Committee appointments included Honours and Awards, Membership, Constitutional, Appeals, Sub-Branch Conference Agenda and State Branch Tribunal.

RSL Representative, Combined Mess, CCOESO.

I don't know of a more dedicated person for Veterans in the RSL environment than Frank. Frank was known to voice his concerns on subjects which affected Veterans and RSL SA, this included the RSL Qld Art Union selling raffle tickets in South Australia around ANZAC Day as well as any organisation which tried to take advantage of days which are and have been recognised traditionally and historically as days to raise funds for RSL Welfare. Frank's support is evidence with a request, in lieu of flowers, for a donation to RSL welfare.

I may have missed some other important aspects of Frank's involvement in the RSL and I apologise to those involved. Frank's involvement in the Morphett Vale Sub-Branch and Onkaparinga Council has been enormous and recognised in awards.

Frank will be greatly missed by the Members of CCOOC, the Consolidated Council of Old Codgers. The group met regularly to discuss the problems of the RSL and the world. The group may solve a few problems and create many more, especially after sharing a red or two.

I doubt if Frank would have achieved all his volunteer work in the RSL, and other organisations, without the support of Dierdre and Family. On behalf of all we sincerely thank you for sharing Frank.

I believe some of the extracts I have taken from a few on the RSL Facebook page, and personal messages acknowledging Frank, will speak for most attending today.

So touched by his kindness and generosity, Rest In Peace you beautiful sweet soul, we were blessed to have known you, even for such a short time.

He was never afraid to voice his opinion whether he would put noses out of joint or not.



We often disagreed on Veteran matters and a few times he voted against my motions or ideas but would always come to me with his reasons and engage in debate.

If Frank prefaced a statement with "in my opinion" then the reality was that this was going to be the final statement on whatever was being discussed.

Frank will be sadly missed within the veteran community - a wonderful advocate & tireless worker for all veterans.

Rest in peace Frank, and thank you for your long and dedicated service to the RSL family.

Such sad news and really devastating to hear the loss of such a wonderful man.

Frank, an honour to know you.

RIP Frank. It was an absolute pleasure to know you.

A true gentleman and wonderful person.

And simply RIP.

The little girl replied, directly into the minister's clip-on microphone, 'Yes, and my Mum says it's a bitch to iron.'




