Killed in Action 1.9.18

We had assembled in the Peronne for a start on the morning at daybreak and were lying on the road for the word to advance and casualty stood up talking to some mates when he was shot dead by a sniper. He was carried away on a stretcher but I don't know where he was buried. He was about 5ft. 8" in height, dark complexion, about 28 years and was known as Fred by his mates and came from Balmain N.S.W. where he was a hairdresser.
