## **27th Battalion Grave Photographic Expedition**

The 27th Battalion history 'The Blue and Brown Diamond' relates that 4210 Sergeant Henry Matthew Skinner MM and battalion photographer 5541 Private Glen Roy Barrington left Mont-sur-Marchienne, Belgium on 2 February 1919 to photograph scattered graves of soldiers of the unit at the request of Lieutenant Colonel Frederick Royden Chalmers with the intention of supplying the next of kin with a photograph of the deceased soldier's grave. In all 66 photographs were taken, with Skinner featuring in a number of the images.


The Battalion funded the purchase of a camera through its adjutant Captain Ronald Dudley Southon MC for Private Barrington to photograph the graves. The camera and negatives were later acquired by Major John L Treloar on behalf of the Australian War Museum, reimbursing costs for the camera to Captain Southon. After the war Barrington established a photographic studio whilst Skinner co-authored the 27th Battalion history 'The Blue and Brown Diamond'.
