## Heber Mallalieu



Private (Pte) 6903 Heber Mallalieu enlisted in the 23<sup>rd</sup> Infantry Battalion in the 6<sup>th</sup> Infantry Brigade of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Australian Division in Hamilton on 30 July 1917. He embarked overseas on 21 November and disembarked in Southampton, via short stops at Suez and Taranto, on 23 January 1918, where he joined the 6<sup>th</sup> (Brigade) Training Battalion.

He departed England on 15 April and landed in France two days later, where he was taken on strength of the 23<sup>rd</sup> Battalion near Millencourt on 20 April. They remained on the Somme and on 19 May 1918 the 6<sup>th</sup> Brigade attacked and captured Ville sur Ancre, plus about 330 Germans. The 23<sup>rd</sup> Battalion was involved in mopping up duties only and sustained three casualties (one killed).

On 4 July, the battalion then participated in the successful Battle of Le Hamel and captured 90 German prisoners for the loss of 75 casualties (ten killed) of their own.

The Amiens offensive commenced on 8 August, and in the weeks that followed, the 23<sup>rd</sup> Battalion pursued and fought the retreating Germans, including at Mont St Quentin on 31 August, where they lost another 39 men killed (of the 120 rifles they started the day with). The battalion was held as Brigade reserve for the last AIF action of the war at Montbrehain on 5 October, after which they left the line for the last time.

Pte Mallalieu was detached to the Australian Corps School from 7 January -29 April 1919, then he returned to England on 8 May and subsequently embarked for Australia on 23 July.

Private 6903 Heber Mallalieu disembarked in Melbourne on 11 October, where he was discharged from the AIF on 10 November 1919.
