Alfred Walbanche

Private (Pte) 4813 Alfred Walbanche enlisted in the 21st Infantry Battalion in the 6th Infantry Brigade of the 2nd Australian Division in Brunswick on 23 February 1916.

He embarked overseas on 4 April, but his service record is silent as to where and when he disembarked in England.

He left England on 16 September and landed in France the next day, where he was taken on strength of the 21st Battalion, in the field at Brandhoek, Belgium on 28 September.

After a short rest period, the battalion headed south and moved into the front line near Flers on 3 November, where they experienced the heavy, energy sapping mud for the first time, and it was here that Pte Walbank sustained a gunshot wound to his right leg on 8 November 1916.

He was evacuated to the 5^{th} General Hospital at Rouen from 10-15 November, then transferred to England and admitted to the Duchess of Connaught's Canadian Red Cross Hospital at Taplow from 17 November – 5 December.

After his recovery, he was also diagnosed with varicose veins and deemed "over-age", and he embarked for return to Australia on 13 February 1917.

Private 4813 Alfred Walbanche disembarked in Melbourne on 12 April, where he was medically discharged from the AIF on 18 May 1917.
