
Herbert John Lewis

Trooper (Tpr) Herbert John Lewis enlisted in the 13th Light Horse Regiment in Geelong on 26 January 1915. He embarked overseas on 28 May and disembarked in Egypt in late June, where he was later promoted to Lance Corporal (L Cpl) on 9 August.

After two months training in Egypt, the 13th Light Horse sailed for Gallipoli on 4 September (without their horses). They disembarked a week later and entered the front line trenches at Lone Pine on 14 September.

Although the main fighting had finished by this stage and a stalemate ensued, the position regularly came under Turkish artillery fire, and it was here on 19 September that L Cpl Lewis sustained multiple shrapnel wounds to his right leg (which was fractured), left arm and head.

He was evacuated to Egypt via HMHS *Guildford Castle* later the same day, where he was treated at the 15th General Hospital at Alexandria from 25 September – 9 October.

He was subsequently transferred to the 1st Australian General Hospital at Heliopolis between 9 October – 2 January 1916, then embarked for return to Australia the following day.

Lance Corporal 311 Herbert John Lewis disembarked in Melbourne later that month but wasn't medically discharged from the AIF until 5 January 1917.
