## Joseph Arthur Gilbert



Private (Pte) 1743 Joseph Arthur Gilbert enlisted in the 14<sup>th</sup> Infantry Battalion in the 4<sup>th</sup> Infantry Brigade of the New Zealand and Australian Division in Melbourne on 11 January 1915. He embarked overseas on 29 March and disembarked in Egypt in late April.

Pte Gilbert embarked for Gallipoli a month later, where he was subsequently taken on strength of the 14<sup>th</sup> Battalion, manning the front line at Courtney's Post, on 26 May.

He contracted bronchitis on 16 July and was evacuated to Malta, where he was hospitalised at St David's Hospital from 25 July – 9 August. He then returned to Egypt and eventually rejoined the 14<sup>th</sup> Battalion at Gallipoli on 24 August.

On 23 November, he contracted mumps and was treated at the 1<sup>st</sup> Light Horse Field Ambulance between 23 November – 11 December, after which he was transferred to Egypt and spent a week at the Mustapha Convalescent Depot from 15 – 22 December, around the same time the Australians evacuated Gallipoli.

Pte Gilbert was admitted to the 1<sup>st</sup> Australian Dermatological Hospital in Cairo with venereal disease between 15 – 25 February 1916, then returned to the 14<sup>th</sup> Battalion at Tel el Kebir on 5 March, where he was also promoted to Lance Corporal (L Cpl) on 13 March. The battalion left Egypt on 1 June and arrived in Marseilles on 8 June 1916, then travelled north.

On 6 August, the 14<sup>th</sup> Battalion entered the line at Pozieres and participated in the unsuccessful assault on Mouquet Farm a few days later, at a cost of 487 casualties, one of whom was L Cpl Gilbert who was killed in action on 11 August 1916. His brother, Charles, later buried him near where he fell.

Lance Corporal 1743 Joseph Arthur Gilbert's body was subsequently re-interred at Serre Road Cemetery No. 2, Hebuterne, France in 1930.
