## Arthur Thomas (Con) Wright



Private (Pte) 1501 Arthur Thomas Wright enlisted in the 301<sup>st</sup> Mechanical Transport Company in Melbourne on 26 October 1914 and embarked for Egypt on 22 December. While enroute, the ship was diverted to England, where they disembarked on 15 February 1915.

They left England on 12 July and disembarked at Rouen on 15 July, becoming one of the first Australian units to serve in France, predating the arrival of the bulk of the AIF by eight months. They drove north to Steenvorde, where they were redesignated as 17<sup>th</sup> Division Ammunition Sub Park and operated under the command of the British 17<sup>th</sup> Division.

Pte Wright was promoted to Driver (Dvr) on 28 August and then granted leave in France from 10 - 17 April 1916, around the time the unit was renamed  $1^{st}$  Division Ammunition Sub Park, and its command reverted to the recently arrived  $1^{st}$  Australian Division.

The year 1917 was an eventful one for Dvr Wright, who was treated at several medical facilities for various ailments, including a foot abscess (9 - 16 January), middle ear infection (16 February - 5 March) and venereal disease (6 September - 30 October). He was also granted additional leave in France between 19 - 29 June and charged with being drunk while driving a motor lorry on 3 September, for which he was docked 21 days' pay.

Dvr Wright was given furlough in England from 6-21 February 1918 and, three weeks after his return to France, the unit was renamed  $1^{st}$  Australian Mechanical Transport Company and became part of the  $1^{st}$  Division Supply Column on 12 March.

He departed France for the final time on 2 November and landed in England the next day, where he embarked for return to Australia (on 1914 leave) on 3 December 1918.

Driver 1501 Arthur Thomas Wright disembarked in Melbourne on 27 January, where he was discharged from the AIF on 28 March 1919.
