George Wright



Private (Pte) 2552 George Wright enlisted in the 54th Infantry Battalion in the 14th Infantry Brigade of the 5th Australian Division at Dubbo on 9 March 1916. He embarked overseas on 19 August and disembarked in Plymouth on 13 October, where he joined the 14th (Brigade) Training Battalion in Wiltshire.

He left England on 14 December and landed in France the next day, where he was taken on strength of the 54th Battalion, in the field at Buire, on 24 December 1916.

The conditions in the trenches during the northern winter were atrocious and Pte Wright came down with a fever on 12 February 1917. He was initially treated at the 15th Field Ambulance, then transferred to the Canadian General Hospital at Etaples between 2 – 9 March, before he rejoined the 54th Battalion on 12 April.

During the Second Battle of Bullecourt, the 54^{th} Battalion moved into the new front line between 13-18 May to defend the gains made by the 2^{nd} Division. They fought off several strong German counterattacks and lost 282 men, including 81 killed or missing.

Pte Wright contracted influenza on 1 June and was treated at the 10th General Hospital at Rouen until 17 June, when he was transferred to England. He was admitted to the Bath War Hospital between 18 June – 17 July, then granted leave.

While recuperating at Perham Downs Camp, Pte Wright was charged with drunkenness and violently resisting arrest on 26 July, for which he was awarded ten days' Field Punishment No. 2 – which essentially meant extra work duties.

Not long after, it was discovered that Pte Wright suffered from a loss of cartilage in his right knee joint, and he was returned to Australia for Home Service on 27 August.

Private 2252 George Wright disembarked in Sydney on 24 October, where he was medically discharged from the AIF on 5 December 1917.
