He was buried just over top of trouch and a cross erected which I have seen with name and number on. Not in a cemetery. The name of the support trench was Bulls Run.

or Jamery 21st while we were in supports to the right of Flors in a trench known as fulls trench a shell landedright on top of a dugout. I helped to dig out the occupants who were three battern, Noman, (battern to Lt. Pentland of South Melbourne) Pto. Michells, battern to Hajor Waine, then Capt now missing, and Pto. Norder. All were badly amasked. Hoonan and tioned Nicholls were dead and Nicholls died soon after. I gave all their personal belongings to Lt. Pentland. They were buried that evening under my superintendence in the same grave just behind the spot where they were killed. We could not have a Service as Fritz started to shell us heavily just then. A cross was put up after dark with his name on. Noonan was fair and freekled. Age under 25. He was a fellow full of life and merriment. He left Australia with Lt. Pentland and as his batman. Of his initial and No. I am not certain. The grave is about 17 miles to the right of Flors looking oast, a hundred yards or more from a sunken road. Reference: - 8gt.J.A.Paxton. 46.D. 3870.XV.
