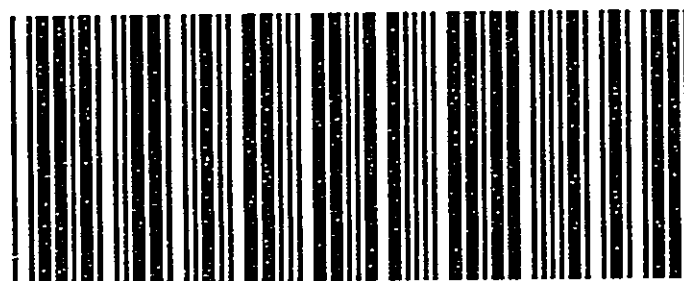

He was one of twentyone men who were buried and killed by the explosion of a German mine, about midday on 27 or 28 November 1916. I helped to dig him out and he was afterwards buried in a civilian cemetery at Hersin, near Doos and a cross erected. Spr. Praed and all the others whose bodies were recovered were buried there. I do not remember the names of the others, I had only just joined the Coy. Francis came from Tasmania in the same reinforcements with me, his christian name was Harry.

"Killed in Action 28.11.16"

These men were working in "Black Watch Sap" at Hill 70 close to Loos they were loading a mine when a premature explosion took place. They were all killed outright, at about 2 p.m. on 28.11.16

As far as I can remember 10 men were removed and buried at Hersin not far from Hœux, including Coulton D. 4304, and Francis H.F. 2893, and one large cross was erected suitably inscribed. I was on the same shifts as these men, but not on that particular job. Eyewitness to all but actual explosion. The party consisted of 13 men and all were killed.

Casualties were attached to Imperial Army at the Time. Hill 80.

Crosses suitably inscribed were erected to all, by our Company, I seen them all buried and a photograph of their graves, were forwarded to their relatives in Australia.
