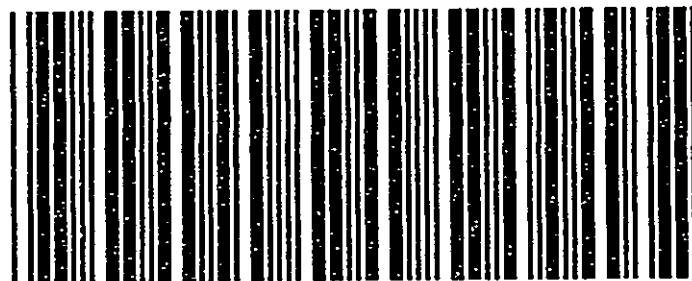

We should be glad if you will inform us if No 753 Pte.

Marshall Burrows of your unit is at present Missing although there is no official report of any casualty, a postcard dated 19-1-18 has been received from No 753 Pte. M. Burrows, 4th Pioneer Bttn, A.I.F., advising us that he is Prisoner of War in Germany, wounded in the hands. This information came through the Frankfurt Red Cross and we should be glad to hear from you before accepting it as quite authentic.
