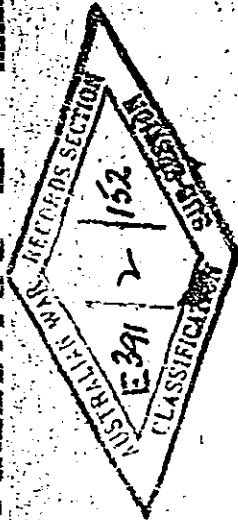

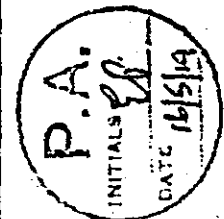

On the morning of 5th April, 1918, near BERNANQCOURT, this N.C.O. displayed great bravery and devotion to duty during an attack by the enemy in overwhelming numbers. He assisted his officer in organising an Engineer working party in a support line under very heavy fire. Several men being wounded, he went to their assistance and was himself wounded. He, however, continued to adjust field dressings with the utmost bravery even after being wounded a second time.	O.C. 12th Fd. Coy, A.E. C.R.E. 4th A.D.	M.M.	
	12th Fd. Coy, A.F.	1941	Sapper, Rowland HEATHCOTE.	At BERNANQCOURT on 5th April, 1918, this Sapper showed great bravery and devotion to duty whilst acting as Company runner during very heavy enemy shelling.
