He was not tent out of the line and lived some hours. I did not see him. He was buried on the battalefield. I saw the gross which had been made for his grave, with his name, regiment etc. on it.

He was in R Co. He had been in C Co. and come back to B Co. We were attacking at Messines on the lith June. During the attack I saw It. Mests hit by shrapnel. He was hit all over and badly knocked about. I was about 50 yards from him at the time. I saw him later on, when the attack quietened down. He was dead. When I was at Plugstraet about a month after. I saw a cross soing up with Lt. Mests's name on it. I was told he was buried where he fell. There was a tree there, and his initials were cut on it.
