Downes had charge of the collection of all prisoners of the Brigade (wait to talled approximately 1500). This duty entailed his personal supervision in the forward area, immediately behind the attacking troops. Despite the very heavy Artillery and Machine Gun fire, which swept the area, Lieut. Downes moved about from place to place, collecting, arranging necessary escort and directing prisoners to Brigade Head Quarters. The cheeriness and example set by this Officer, under most strenuous conditions, inspired all, and the necessary task was carried out without a hitch. Immediately the Brigade was relieved from the above Sector, Lieut. Downes was detailed for duty with the 107th. Regiment, 27th. America Division, for a further attack on the Hindenburg system. On 26th. September 1918, when the above Regiment attacked the village of BONY, Lieu Downes was personally in charge of the supply of all rations, ammunition &c. of the attacking troops. This was a most difficult task on account of the inexperience of the troops engage and in order to ensure that supplies of rations ammunition &c. reached the attacking troops, Lieut. Downes repeatedly guided pack animals and transport forward under exceptionally heavy artillery, machine gun and rifle fire from the enemy selected positions. The ground traverse was absolutely torn up by artillery fire and harb wire and debris was lying about in abundance which rendered going most difficult.	n t		25
