

Virtual War Memorial Australia Research Checklist – WW II

This fact sheet will guide you through researching an individual who served Australia in World War Two. The first page points you in the direction of resources that will give you basic details about the individual and their service. The second page helps you to take your research further and find extra information.


Extending Your Research

AWM - UNIT DIARIES

These record the daily activities of headquarters, formations and units. You will need to know the unit and class (eg. Infantry) in which your individual served.



AWM - COLLECTIONS

The AWM holds thousands of sources including photographs, letters and personal diaries. Even if your person did not leave a record, there may still be evidence about them in the records of others. Check records linked to their unit.
