### "Killed in Action 5.5.17."

Re 3752 Pte. Earp F.C. Pte. Earp belonged to my platoon which on the night of 6th May formed a fatigue party to the front line at Bullecourt. Earp was a member of the party and was last seen going in the direction of the front line at Bubent Midnight. The shelling at the time was very heavy and the platoon had several casualtyies and on its return Exap was reported Missing. Sometime after the Bettn had been relieved an intimation was received that his body had been buried by the 5th Battn. There is every reason to believe that he was killed somewhere near midnight 6-7th May near the front line trenches at Bullecourt. Whether his grave was marked or whether its location was noted I cannot at present say but I am making further enquiries and will advise you furter in due course. As far as I can remember Pte. Earp was about 5'7or8" in height of sturdy build fair heir, and about 26 years of age.
