

OUR MEN'S INJURIES.

In the 84th casualty list issued yesterday appear the following Geelong and district men:—Pte. G. H. Pendleton, of Bellarine, who enlisted in South Australia, dangerously ill; Pte. S. J. Drake, of Drysdale, prisoner of war at Constantinople, previously reported missing; Sergt. R. W. Brinsmead, of Leopold, previously ill at Malta, is now in hospital at London; and Corpl. W. Mathews, of Newtown, previously treated at Malta for a wound and fever, is now in hospital in London.

Mr. Chas. Foster, Protestant Orphanage, Herne Hill, has been informed by the Defence Department that his son, Gunner E. C. Foster, was wounded in Gallipoli on September 11th. Gunner Foster enlisted from Derrinallum in August, 1914, and was attached to the 2nd Brigade Field Artillery.

Pte. G. C. Hambling, of South Geelong, is amongst the wounded returned to Melbourne yesterday.
