Gor was awarded the Belgium Croix De Guerre for valour. The Croix de Guerre is bestowed to individuals who distinguish themselves by acts of heroism involving combat with enemy forces. Gor's was awarded for service on the Western Front during operations

Gor's original citation for recommending an award. It reads:

During operations on the 8th and 9th August 1918 ths NCO did splendid work. On the 8th when the operation was held up he showed great courage in moving up and down the line under fire and organising the Lewis Guns of three platoons so as that they would give good covering fire and thus enabling the sections to continue the advance. By his fearlessness he inspired the rest of the men. The splendid example set by this NCO is worthy of recognition.



ENLISTMENT and TRAINING:

Gor enlisted in the army 22 July 1915. According to what I can ascertain his place of enlistment was Melbourne, not Apsley. It appears from his records that he initially trained with the 20th Castlemaine Depot Battalion however I have not been able to find out anything about that battalion.

Reinforcements were only given basic training in Australia. Training was completed in training units in England. These were located in the Salisbury Plains area.



WOUNDS

Gor was wounded on three occasions. On the first occasion, in which he received gunshot wound to the head (GSW), he was repatriated to England for recovery. On the other two occasions he remained on duty and the exact nature of his wounds is not known.




Gor (signified by red cross) recovering in hospital after being wounded on the first occasion. Note the bandaging to the head.




The wound stripe kit.

The metal stripe went to the outside of the sleeve, the backing bar went inside and the spring pin held everything together. Gor would have been entitled to three wound stripes.


Notification letters to the family informing them Gor had been wounded. Note the vast information provided, particularly the first wounding




Parental notification of first wounding
